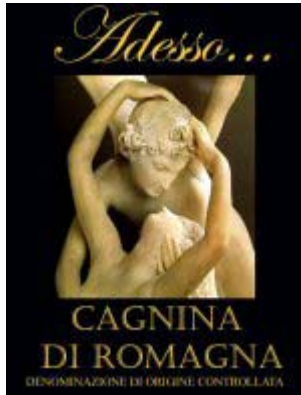


# “ADESSO,” CAGNINA DI ROMAGNA, DOC, 2006

This is the EXACT same wine as the Camauro. The wine comes from the same source --- only the bottlers and packaging has changed. This is the wine that's easy to fall in love with "*adesso*" (which means "now" in Italian).

Nobody knows where the name "Cagnina" (cahn-yee-nah) comes from but it is known that the wine has been made *only* in the Romagna region, just south of Venice since the 13th century, and that it was even called Cagnina in those days.

**Tasting notes:** Grapey, jammy smooth as silk and unctuously sweet.

**Region:** Emilia-Romagna

**Classification:** Cagnina di Romagna DOC

**Area of Production:** Rimini

**Grape Variety:** 100% Refosco

**Soil:** Clay

**Average Age of Vines:** 15 - 20 years

**Spacing of Plants:** 3.30 m. x 1.40 m.

**Trellising System:** Doppio Capovolto

**Production per Acre:** 5.80 tons

**Vinification Technique:** 15 day maceration; fermentation is halted when both the sugar content and alcohol level reach their defined levels; approximately 10 days.

**Maturation:** Stainless Steel

**Total Acidity:** 6.2 g/l

**PH:** 3.40

**Sugar Content:** 70 g/l

**Alcohol:** 9%

**Total Cases Produced:** 29,160
